#### Fascinating Facts and Figures:

Increased Internet Usage: The widespread adoption of technology and the internet has led to an increased use of digital devices among children in primary schools. According to a study by Ofcom, 99% of children between the ages of 5 and 15 years were using the internet in the UK, with 55% of 3-4year-olds using tablets.

Parental Concerns: According to a survey conducted by the National Online Safety organization in the UK, 95% of parents were concerned about their child's online safety. However, only 32% felt confident enough to talk to their children about online risks.
