

What do we need to know?

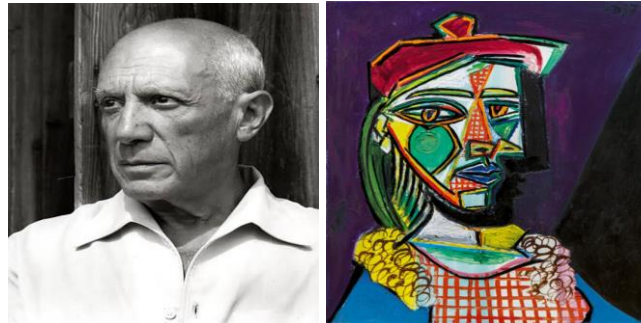
Must - I must know that Picasso was a famous Spanish artist who painted in lots of different styles. He co-founded the famous art style of cubism.

Key Vocabulary

Abstract Art	This form of art does not show what objects or living things look like in real life. It uses colour, line and shapes to make images and represent feelings.
Cubism	This is a style of art that takes landscapes, objects, and living things, and transforms them into geometric shapes. Artists paint different viewpoints of the subjects they are painting at the same time.

Key Knowledge

Picasso was a Spanish artist and is one of the most famous artists in the world.

When he was baptised, his name was 23 words long!

His first word was 'piz', short for 'lapiz', the Spanish word for pencil.

Picasso's father was an artist. He gave him art lessons.

Picasso was known as an experimenter he changed his style many times.

Picasso liked to create observational sketches of facial features.

In Cubist artwork, objects are analysed, broken up and reassembled in an abstracted form.

Picasso drew portraits in the cubism style using simple shapes. He often used colour to reflect his mood.
