<u>Discovery Learning – Tapestry</u>

We are very pleased to announce that we are now using Tapestry as our online learning journal provider.

Tapestry allows you to login with a secure username and password so you can view all your children's observations, photographs and videos. You can like and comment on observations that we add for your child and it's also possible for you to add your own observations. Your comments and own observations will allow us to find out about which activities your child really enjoyed and the learning they get up to at home.

It's also possible for you to be notified via email if there are new entries for you to view. There are lots of features we will look to develop in the future such as documents, memos and activities to do at home.

As explained above, we will use Tapestry to send you observations of your child which might include photos and videos. If you give your permission in the <u>form here</u>, you will be able to see group observations which might include photos and videos with other children as well as your own and consequently, other parents/carers might be able to view photos and videos of your child.

We do hope you enjoy using Tapestry, do let us know if you have any questions about it.

Living Autism Foundation

Living Autism Foundation is a charity who help autistic people, their families and carers. One of our main objectives is to provide workshops which will offer information and approaches to help reduce anxieties and to improve health and wellbeing.

We have organised our next workshop at York CVS, 15 Priory Street, York, YO1 6ET,

on Saturday 16th March 2024 from 09.30am to 12.30pm. Our guest speaker, Geoff Evans is one of the country's leading authorities on autism, with over 30 years' experience. Geoff will provide an overview of Pathological Demand (Extreme) Avoidance, including how it is defined and its impact upon the autistic person and their families. He will discuss possible explanations including; high levels of stress and anxiety; Intolerance of Uncertainty (IoU); and low self esteem; as well as the behaviours/strategies the young person may use to avoid demands. He will also explore ways of supporting the individual and where further advice and support can be accessed.

The workshops are free to attend, however, should anyone attending feel they could support these or future workshops with a voluntary donation, this would be very much appreciated. A large part of our funding relies on donations.


Home to School Travel Policy
