Vocabulary

Sculpt - To create something using shaping techniques.

Sculptor - An artist who creates sculptures.

Material - What something is made from.

Design - A plan of what is going to be made.

Abstract - A piece of art that is not life-like or realistic.

Figurative - A piece of art that is easy to recognise and life-like.

Media - The materials used by an artist.

Texture - How something feels or appears.

Join - To fix materials together.

Key questions

- What are you going to make?
- Is your sculpture going to be abstract or figurative?
- What materials are you going to use?
- How are you going to fix or join materials together?
- How are you going to use colours, lines and shapes?
- Which sculptors inspire you?
- Why do you like their work?
