This term the children across the Infant school have had various opportunities to increase their levels of physical activity and improve their skills in physical education. Some of these opportunities were:

- Extra-Curricular P.E. Club; Multi-Club and HTAFC Girl's Wildcats
- Specialised P.E. Lesson with Miss Tremble in Bright Class (Years 1 and 2).
- Forest Schools across KS1 for the Summer Term
- Sports days in EYFS and KS1 with help from the Year 6 Sports Crew
- Year 6 Sports Leaders delivering mini-games to children across KS1 on the Junior field.

Extra-Curricular Sport Clubs

This term the children across Key Stage 1 have had the opportunity to take part in a Multi-club, which involved some physical activity as well as a club run by HTAFC called Wildcats and aimed at girls playing football.

Both clubs have allowed the children attending these clubs to be physically active in a number of ways including playing football and ribbon dancing.

The children in Wildcats have made some great improvements with their football skills and have increased their confidence at the same time. The children in Wildcats will continue this club over the Summer term and there will also be another club ran by the teachers, which will allow the children to take part in another physical activity.



Specialised P.E. lessons with Miss Tremble

This term, Miss Tremble has been working alongside the other teachers in Key Stage 1 to deliver a range of P.E. lessons including Athletics, games and cricket skills.

In Reception, the children have covered two Real PE units, sports day activities as well as lots of mini-games.

In Years 1 and 2 the children have covered all the different athletics activities that they would do on sports day as well as a range of mini games and cricket skills focusing on catching and throwing.

Miss Tremble has been able to use her sporting and coaching background to make all the P.E. lessons interesting and fun meaning all the children are engaged and active in most of the lesson even if it means they have their own challenges to complete compared to other children.



Forest School Sessions led by Born of the Forest

Children in KS1 have had the lovely opportunity to attend Forest Schools every week with Born of the Forest. Each class has had the chance to have a go in the forest area and have had a great time.

They have taken part in lots of fun activities such as cooking, arts and crafts, den building as well as using the rope swings and balance ropes.

The children are super excited for their forest school lessons to continue next year.



Sports Day 2025

The children in KS1 and reception enjoyed their sports day on the Junior field and the infant running track taking part in lots of different activities.

These included; egg and spoon, sack race, obstacle course, races and a long run.

The children also had help from the Year 6 sports crew who supported them with the activities and showed them how to do it.



Year 6 Sports Leaders Sessions to KS1 children

Lots of our KS1 children (mainly Year 2's) took part in a Year 6 sports leaders event on the Junior field. The children were separated into 6 groups and they had a go at 6 different activities organised and planned by the Year 6 sports leaders. Some of the game included rock, paper, scissors, football, and other multi-skill based games. The children from KS1 had a wonderful time and loved working with the older children as well as helping with transition from Year 2 to Year 3 in September. The Year 6 children did incredibly well with their leadership skills and delivered some fun and exciting games for the children, what a great way for them to start their sports leadership journey.
